

The East Multnomah Soil and Water Conservation District (EMSWCD) is a unit of local government serving the portion of Multnomah County, Oregon that is east of the Willamette River, with offices located in Portland. EMSWCD's work is non-regulatory and is

focused on using cutting edge conservation to keep water clean and soil healthy. The area the District serves is very diverse and ranges from downtown Portland to the farms of east Multnomah County to the scenic Columbia River Gorge.

This position provides an excellent opportunity to work with a supportive board of directors and lead a dedicated staff of 17 in a stably funded, fiscally well-managed organization committed to conserving and restoring the area's natural resources. The ideal candidate will have a passion for conservation in urban and rural landscapes.



THE AREA

Located in northwest Oregon, Multnomah County, population approximately 748,000, is the state's smallest county geographically, yet it contains approximately twenty percent of Oregon's population due to the high density found in Portland and the surrounding cities. Portland is Oregon's most populous city and approximately 2,289,800 people live in the Portland metropolitan area. Its mild weather, breathtaking scenery, and friendly people make the area a great place to live. Located in the Marine west coast climate region, Portland has a climate marked by both warm, dry summers and wet, cool-to-chilly winter days.



Portland is consistently rated as one of the best places to live in the country. Noted for its efficient land-use planning, investment in public transportation, good air quality, renewable energy leadership, and environmentally friendly building practices, Portland is also frequently named one of the top "green" cities in the US. The Portland metro area has an excellent transportation system, including Tri-Met MAX Light Rail, WES Commuter Rail, Portland Streetcar, and bus service, as well as an extensive bikeway network and an active bicycling culture.

Portland is known for the abundant outdoor activities the area provides, its progressive politics, support of the arts, its celebrated music and restaurant scenes, coffee culture, microbreweries and pioneering the food cart movement. World-class wine is produced in the Willamette Valley, the center of the Oregon wine industry, just a half hour's drive away.

THE DISTRICT & POSITION

EMSWCD is led by an elected board of five directors and non-voting associate directors. The Board of Directors represents the public, provides oversight, sets policy, supervises the Executive Director, and sets the strategic direction of the District. The District's total General Fund is \$5,732,974 for budget year 2013-14. EMSWCD's 18-member staff provides a wide variety of programs and services to urban and rural residents and businesses.

The Executive Director is the chief executive officer of the District, responsible for the management of District operations; supervision of District staff; fiscal management; representation of the District to the public and partner organizations; and the provision of information, advice, and support to the Board of Directors and the staff.
