## DAHP Compliance under Governor's Executive Order 05-05 (GEO 05-05) rev October 2013

## QUESTION: WHAT DO I NEED TO DO TO FULFILL MY GEO 05-05 RESPONSIBILITY?

Contact the Department of Archaeology and Historic Preservation (DAHP):
a) For projects involving ground disturbing activities complete and then email DAHP's EZ 1 that can be
downloaded at: <a href="http://www.dahp.wa.gov/governors-executive-order-05-05">http://www.dahp.wa.gov/governors-executive-order-05-05</a> . Submit to Rob Whitlam,
State Archaeologist: <u>rob.whitlam@dahp.wa.qov</u> .
b) For projects that involve a building or structure that is over 50 years in age, search DAHP's WISAARD
on-line database <a href="https://fortress.wa.gov/dahp/wisaard/">https://fortress.wa.gov/dahp/wisaard/</a> to see if the building has already been reviewed.

c) Based upon (b), you may need to complete the EZ 3 form available for download at:

Contact your State granting agency contact person regarding seeking comments from tribes who
may be interested in your project. Resources include the Washington State Tribal Directory at:
http://www.goia.wa.gov/Tribal-Directory/TribalDirectory.pdf and the Governor's Office of Indian
Affairs at: <a href="http://www.goia.wa.gov/">http://www.goia.wa.gov/</a> .
If DAHP and/or Tribes do not have any concerns, they will mail/email you a letter to that effect.
DAHP and/or Tribes may request more information and recommend a survey of the project site
for archaeological sites and/or historic buildings/structures.
If a survey is recommended, be sure to obtain qualified consultants. Lists of qualified consultants can
be found at: <a href="http://preservewa.org/Current-Directory.aspx">http://preservewa.org/Current-Directory.aspx</a>

If DAHP and/or Tribes express concerns about impacts of your projects, contact the appropriate
DAHP and/or Tribal staff person for questions or to resolve those concerns.
If negative impacts or concerns cannot be resolved, DAHP and/or the concerned Tribe will provide you
with a comment letter and recommendations.
Talk with your State agency grant contact person about unresolved impacts and concerns; identify and
agree to next steps and who is responsible to take action.
Handy Tips:
Address potential project impacts to cultural and historic resources as early as possible in your planning process, ideally at the conceptual stage.

- ② Contact DAHP and Tribal staff early and as often as needed about questions, concerns, and next steps.
- ② When needed, only use qualified professional cultural/historical resource consultants to assist you.
- ☑ Take advantage of DAHP's website for information and WISAARD interactive databases to locate historic properties.
- Keep your State agency grant contact person in the loop.
- If a Federal agency is (or becomes) involved with your project (through a permit, funding or a license) contact the Federal agency and DAHP immediately for next steps.
- Budget appropriately in the event consultant services are needed to assist.
- ② Also, in the event that your project damages or alters a significant site or building, DAHP and/or Tribes may recommend that mitigation measures be provided; again, plan and budget appropriately.
- 2 To help you streamline the review time, DAHP staff strives to be as responsive as possible; your assistance is appreciated by providing complete information
